RESPONSIVE READING

Leader: The candles the children light tonight are symbols of peace. The prophet Isaiah proclaimed that God's chosen one, the Messiah, would bring light into the darkness of a troubled world and be known as the Prince of Peace. In the Hebrew language of the Old Testament, the peace of God is referred to as shalom. Shalom is so rich in its meaning that no single English word can translate it. It is a state in which nothing is lacking because everything exists in perfect unity with God.

People: We long for peace in our troubled world.

Leader: As Christians we recognize Jesus Christ as God's promised Messiah. Jesus spoke these words in order to comfort us, "Peace I leave with you; my own peace I now give you. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not allow yourselves to live in fear. My peace is different than the peace the world offers. Rely on me, and I will give you peace."

People: Come, Lord Jesus, fill our hearts with your perfect peace.

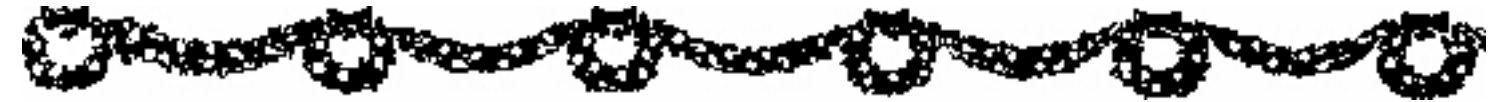
Leader: Let us pray

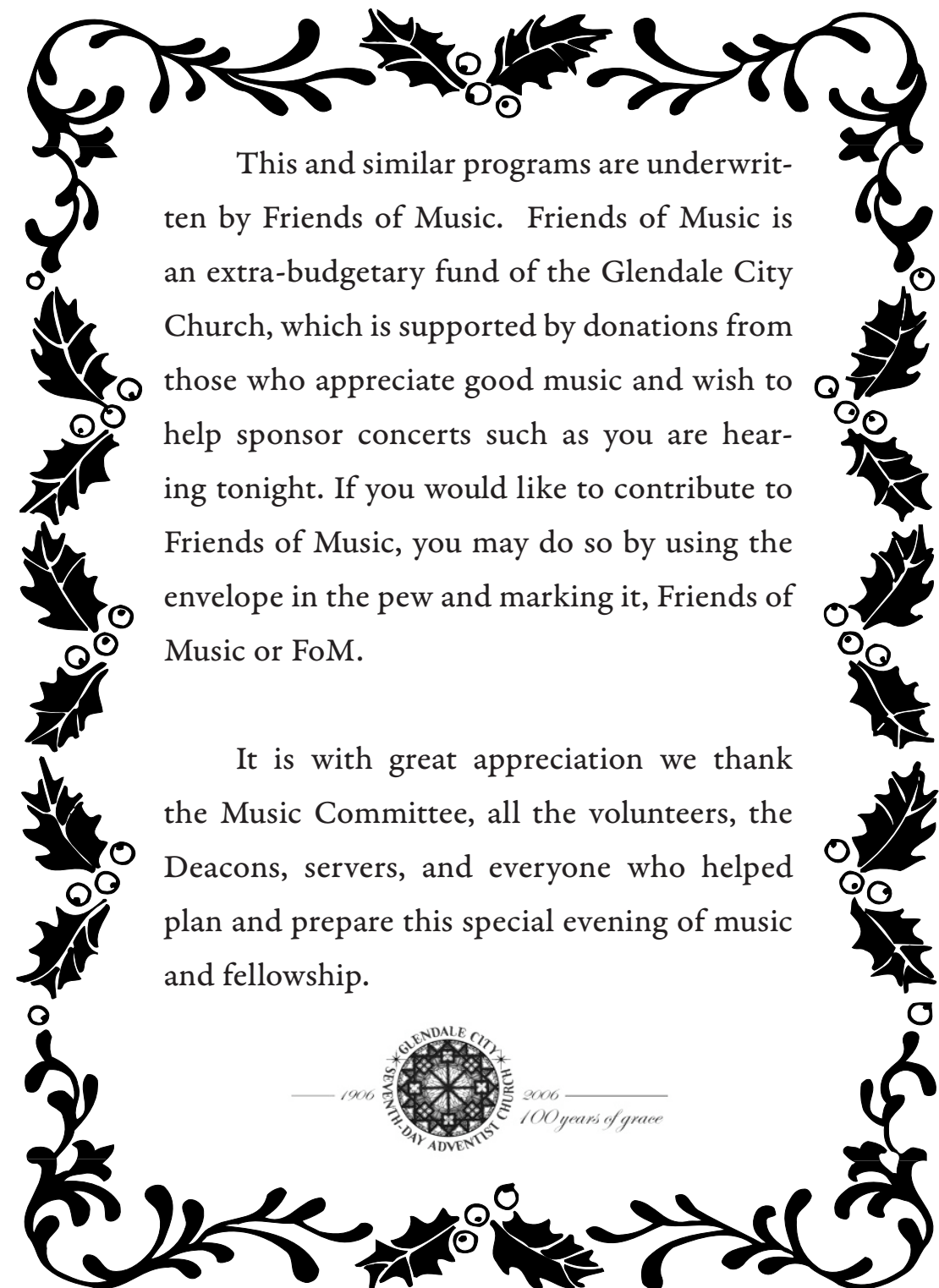
