

## Scripture Reading

### Exodus 4:10–17

Moses said to the LORD,  
"O Lord, I have never been eloquent, neither in the  
past nor since you have spoken to your servant.  
I am slow of speech and tongue."

**The LORD said to him,  
"Who gave man his mouth? Who makes him deaf  
or mute? Who gives him sight or makes him blind?  
Is it not I, the LORD ?**

Now go; I will help you speak and  
will teach you what to say."

But Moses said,  
"O Lord, please send someone else to do it."

Then the LORD's anger burned against Moses and he  
said, "What about your brother, Aaron the Levite? I  
know he can speak well. He is already on his way  
to meet you, and his heart will be glad when he sees you.

**You shall speak to him and put words in his mouth;  
I will help both of you speak and  
will teach you what to do.**

He will speak to the people for you, and it will be  
as if he were your mouth and as if you were God  
to him. But take this staff in your hand  
so you can perform miraculous signs with it."

## Sermon Resources

Moses is the most haunted and haunting figure in all of the Bible. To be sure, he is often portrayed as strong, sure, and heroic, but he is also timid and tortured with self-doubt at key moments in his life. He is the shepherd, mild, and meek, but he is also a ruthless warrior who is capable of blood-shaking acts of violence, a gentle teacher who is also a magician and a wonder-worker, a lawgiver whose code of justice is merciful except when it comes to purging and punishing those who disagree with him, an emancipator who rules his people with unforgiving authority. Whatever he may have looked like—and the Bible never really tells us—the fact is that he hid a disfigured face behind a veil for the last forty years of his long life. He is God's one and only friend, and yet he is doomed to a tragic death by God himself.
