Glendale City Health Education Program Says...

Enjoy **chocolate** on Valentine's Day and every day for heart health? A review of 136 research publications (*Medline*) suggests that **flavonoids** in cocoa and chocolate may benefit cardiovascular risk by lowering blood pressure, inflammation, and blood clot formation; increasing HDL (good cholesterol), and decreasing LDL oxidation and coronary heart disease mortality.

How much chocolate? More research is needed, but it has been suggested that 6.7 grams of dark chocolate every day is ideal—the higher the cocoa/lower the sugar content the better. Tip: 1 measuring teaspoon equals 5 grams.
