Total Cholesterol	Less than 200 mg/dL
LDL ("bad") Cholesterol – depends on risk	Less than 160 mg/dl for low risk Less than 130 mg/dl for intermediate risk Less than 100 mg/dL for high risk Less than 70 mg/dL for very high risk
HDL ("good") Cholesterol	Women: 50 mg/dL or higher Men: 40 mg/dL or higher
Triglycerides	Less than 150 mg/dL
Blood Pressure	Less than 120/80 mmHg
Fasting Blood Sugar (Glucose)	Less than 100 mg/dL
Waist Circumference	Women: 35 inches or less Men: 40 inches or less
