## Glendale City Health Education

### September Is National Preparedness Month

You do have your vehicle earthquake kit(s) in your vehicle(s), right?

#### Now it's time to prepare your home:

- \* Create a Family Earthquake Plan, including where to meet if separated.
- \* Secure water heater and appliances that could move enough to rupture utility lines.
- \* Secure mirrors, artwork, and large or heavy furniture.
- \* Place breakable and heavy objects on lower shelves.
- \* Put latches on cabinet doors to keep closed during shaking.
- \* Keep flammable or hazardous liquids, including cleaning products in cabinets or secured on lower shelves.
- \* Learn how to shut off gas, water, and electricity.

#### Keep the following emergency supplies on hand:

- \* Fire extinguisher
- \* Adequate supplies of medications each family member takes
- \* First-aid kit and handbook
- \* Flashlights with extra bulbs and batteries
- \* Portable radio with extra batteries
- \* Water for each family member for at least 14 days (allow a minimum of 1 gallon per person per day) and purification tablets or bleach to purify drinking water from other sources
- \* Canned and package foods for several days; mechanical can opener
- \* Extra food for pets
- \* Camp stove or barbecue for outdoor cooking; fuel (stored safely, and out of reach of children)
- \* Waterproof, heavy-duty plastic bags for waste disposal

Avoid regrets of "could have, should have, would have." Keep yourself and your cherished family safe by being prepared. True—another earthquake might not happen in the foreseeable future.
