

October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month

As noted previously this month, early detection of breast cancer improves survival rates significantly. The role of monthly breast self-exams in early detection was discussed. Mammograms also play a key role in early detection. Yearly mammograms are recommended for women starting at age 40. To help ensure a good quality mammogram, the following tips are offered:

- * Look for or ask to see an FDA certificate. The U.S. Food and Drug Administration issues a certificate to mammography centers that meet professional standards of safety and quality.
- * Use a facility that specializes in mammograms and performs many each day.
- * If going to a facility for the first time, bring or send previous mammograms and biopsy reports.
- * If satisfied that the facility is of high quality, use the same facility yearly so that mammograms can be compared from year to year.
- * On the day of the exam, do not wear deodorant or antiperspirant. They contain substances that can show up as white spots on the mammogram, making it more difficult to interpret results.
- * Describe to the technologist any breast symptoms or problems, and any related medical or family history.
- * If you do not hear from your physician within 10 days, call! Don't assume the mammogram was normal.

Additionally, Mr. Nelson will share findings from research that has looked at the relationship between spirituality, health, and longevity.
