Sermon Resources

The war in Southeast Asia remained the flashpoint for dissent and bitterness. Philip and Daniel Berrigan, Roman Catholic priests and antiwar activist, broke into Defense Department offices, where they poured blood over files and sabotaged military hardware. Despite Richard Nixon's 1968 campaign promise that he had a plan to end the war in Vietnam, the battle continued, not only in Southeast Asia but also on the campuses and in the coffee shops of America. Dueling bumper stickers declared "AMERICA: LOVE IT OR LEAVE IT" and "AMERICA: CHANGE IT OR LOSE IT." Students erupted in protest across the country, from Berkeley, California to New York City and also in Madison, Wisconsin, and Iowa City, Iowa. On May 4, 1970, twenty-eight Ohio National Guardsmen fired into a group of antiwar protesters at Kent State University in Ohio, leaving four students dead, permanently paralyzing another and wounding eight others, thus reminding the nation yet again of its profound divisions.

"There is a revolution coming," Charles Reich, a social critic, warned in *The Greening of America*, published the same year. "It is now spreading with amazing rapidity, and already our laws, institutions and social structure are changing in consequence. It promises a higher reason, a more human community and a new and liberated individual. Its ultimate creation will be a new and enduring wholeness and beauty—a renewed relationship of man to himself, to other men, to society, to nature and to the land." Although the immediate reality looked rather different, many Americans, especially the younger generation, turned to the East for religious inspiration, in part out of disillusionment with Western religions and in part for the novelty of Hinduism, Sikhism, Buddhism, Zen Buddhism, Taoism, Hare Krishna, or even Transcendental Meditation.

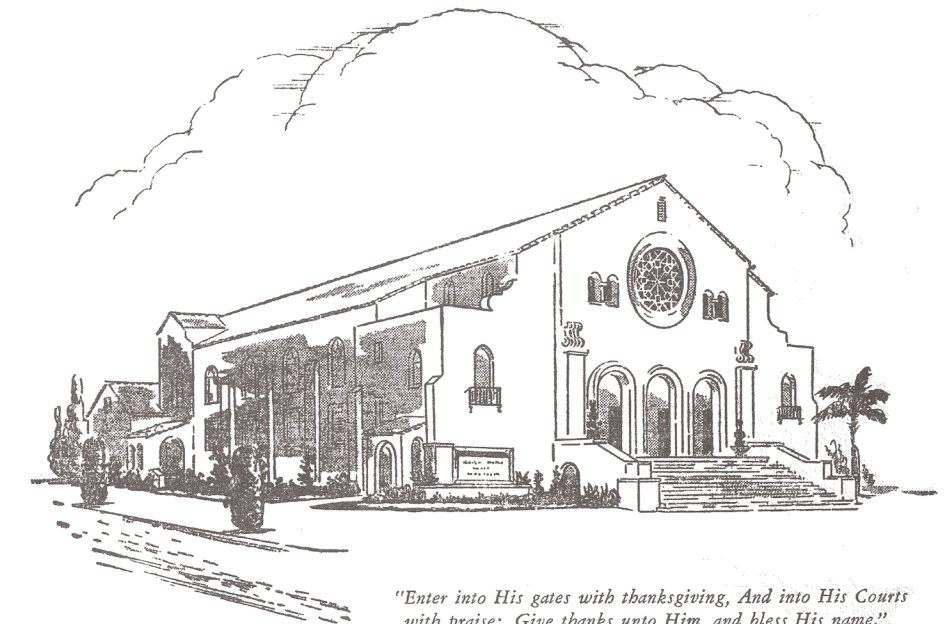
