

## Scripture Reflection

### 1 Kings 19:3-5, 8-13

Elijah was afraid and ran for his life. When he came to Beersheba in Judah, he left his servant there, while he himself went a day's journey into the desert. He came to a broom tree, sat down under it and prayed that he might die.

**“I have had enough, LORD,” he said. “Take my life; I am no better than my ancestors.” Then he lay down under the tree and fell asleep.**

All at once an angel touched him and said, “Get up and eat.” So he got up and ate and drank. Strengthened by that food, he traveled forty days and forty nights until he reached Horeb, the mountain of God. There he went into a cave and spent the night.

**And the word of the LORD came to him: “What are you doing here, Elijah?”**

He replied, “I have been very zealous for the LORD God Almighty. The Israelites have rejected your covenant, broken down your altars, and put your prophets to death with the sword. I am the only one left, and now they are trying to kill me too.”

**The LORD said, “Go out and stand on the mountain in the presence of the LORD, for the LORD is about to pass by.”**

Then a great and powerful wind tore the mountains apart and shattered the rocks before the LORD, but the LORD was not in the wind. ### September Is National Preparedness Month

The kids are back in school. Each has his/her own earthquake kit, but do you have yours? To be prepared, make sure that you have a kit in each vehicle and at work. Check with your employer to see if the company provides a kit for each employee. Kits may be purchased from the American Red Cross, and walk-in or online retailers. Many people prefer to create their own customized kits. If making your own kit, place the following items in a large box or handled bag:

1. Blanket
2. Flashlight with batteries removed and a set of spare batteries
3. Water for 3 days for each person who could be in the vehicle
4. Running/walking shoes
5. Jacket
6. List of telephone numbers of people to call

Keep an implement in the car that will allow you to knock out a window, if necessary. Finally, carry enough cash to cover emergency needs as ATM machines may be out of service.

Let's make a goal that by next Sabbath each of us will have a kit in our vehicles and/or at work. In the following weeks we will review how to be prepared at home.
